<b>English:</b> In English we will be writing a third person adventure story which will link to our Guided Reading story. We will also be writing an explanatory text. In Guided Reading we will be reading Varjak Paw and Wind in the Willows and we will be covering lots of grammatical aspects. These will include punctuating direct speech, fronted adverbials and descriptive devices	<b>Maths:</b> In maths we will be looking at time on analogue and digital clocks before moving on to decimals, shape, money and statistics. We will continue to revisit our prior learning on strategies for the four operations and fractions.	<b>Science:</b> Our science this term will be looking at living things and their habitats alongside how animals and plants can be classified. We will also be learning about animals and humans including nutrition and skeletons.
<b>RE:</b> . In RE we will be looking asking "is it fair?" and looking at what fairness is. We will also finish the year looking at why some people go on a spiritual journey. All of this is based in the Christian faith.	<b>PSHE:</b> We will be following the Cambridgeshire PSHE curriculum module entitled Digital Literacy and then our relationships unit in the final part of the term.	<b>PE/Games:</b> One lesson of PE each week will be taught by the sports coach. This term this will be cricket and tennis. Mrs Clutton will be teaching athletics and rounders. Our PE days will be Thursday and Friday
<b>Computing:</b> We will be learning about animations and effective searching and also making music.	<b>French:</b> In French we will be learning how to talk about other countries in the world and also holidays and hobbies.	<b>Music:</b> We will begin composing our own music and learning about timbre.
Art/DT: In art we will explore the work of Helen Frankenthaler and we will use our knowledge of how to make tints and tones to create an ombre effect with paint. We will explore and experiment with techniques used by other artists. In DT we will explore which shapes can be used to provide stability in structures. We will use a range of materials to investigate 3D shapes and in will collaborate on a class geodesic dome structure	History/Geography: In history we will be learning about the Vikings and Anglo Saxons and the struggle to rule England.
