#### Year 5 Maths Challenge

### **Moments Matter, Attendance Counts**

We talk about this regularly but attendance really does matter. Did you know that just 40% of persistently absent children in KS2 achieved expected KS2 standards, compared with 84% of pupils who regularly attended school. Regular school attendance can help develop positive peer relationships, which is an important factor for mental health and wellbeing.

We understand that hospital and emergency appointments for your child are likely to be during the school day, however please make sure routine dental, doctors and optician appointment are outside of school hours.
