

Benwick Primary School – Autumn Term Curriculum Map for Doves Class & Year 1 Robins



English:

Throughout the **first half term**, the children will be exploring Jack and the Beanstalk, along with alternative versions of the story. They will compare texts, identifying similarities and differences. Written outcomes will include letter writing, along with retelling a familiar story.

During the **second half term**, the children will explore a range of Mini Grey stories. They will write their own version of a fantasy narrative.
