Robins Autumn Term letter 2023

Dear Parents/Carers,

Welcome to the Autumn Term in Robins Class. We hope summer was great and that your children are excited to be starting school. We are all really looking forward to the term ahead and getting to know your children. We have planned lots of exciting activities.

This term we hope to be off to a flying start with learning, however we will settle all the children in, establish relationship, routines, rules and behaviour expectations. Ensuring the children feel happy and confident is really important to us all at Benwick and PSHE is high on our list of priorities.

Please help your child make the best start to the new school year by ensuring they have all the things they need each day, including correct uniform and a water bottle, all of which should be clearly named. Children should not bring in toys or balls etc from home.

Snacks:

Breaktime snacks are encouraged, these should be healthy e.g. fruit or plain cereal bars. Children in Reception and Key Stage 1 are given a piece of fresh fruit/vegetable every daily free of charge. Chocolate bars, biscuits, cakes, crisps, peppermints etc are not allowed. Please remember we are a nut free school due to children with serious allergies.

Reading book arrangements:

Reception: To begin with your child will not bring home a book to read themselves. We will be starting the teaching of phonics straight away and feel it is only fair that we teach your child letter sounds that will enable them to segment and blend words, before we expect them to read a book. When we do give out reading books, your child will be given 2 books each week. These will be changed and monitored regularly by staff. However from the beginning your child will have access to the library from where their choices will be scanned out so that they can borrow beautiful books to share with you at



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home. It is important that these books are returned and scanned back into the library. Any outstanding books will be followed up by letter.

Year 1: Your child will be given three books each week - RWI book bag book, RWI phonics book they have studied in class and a reading for pleasure book. These will be changed and monitored regularly by staff. Children will also have access to the library from where their choices will be scanned out so that they can borrow beautiful books to share with you at home. It is important that these books are returned and scanned back into the library. Any outstanding books will be followed up by letter.

PE arrangements:

Reception: Our class PE/Games session is on Thursday. The children will also have a bikes and trikes session and large equipment session to improve their balance and gross motor skills throughout the week.

Please make sure children have their named PE kit in school all week – this should be a white t-shirt and black shorts/leggings, with tracksuit bottoms in cooler weather and trainers. Football strips and multi-coloured t-shirts and shorts are not allowed, thank you.

Year 1: Our class PE/Games sessions are on Tuesday and Thursday.

Please make sure children have their named PE kit in school all week – this should be a white t-shirt and black shorts/leggings, with tracksuit bottoms in cooler weather and trainers. Football strips and multi-coloured t-shirts and shorts are not allowed, thank you.

Homework expectations:

Reception: Our basic homework expectations for children are:

Daily reading - minimum of 5 minutes – please record when you have heard them read in their reading record

Oral counting, chanting works best, so the children have rapid recall of these facts which greatly improves their ability to access mathematics across the curriculum. In the early years children learn best when doing something, so ask them to sort socks into pairs, to set the table or to count out food items when out shopping. Look for numbers on doors or car number plates talk about letters that you see in the environment.

Year 1: Our basic homework expectations for children are:



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Daily reading - minimum of 15 minutes – please record when you have heard them read in their reading record.

Spelling – spellings are given out on Monday and are tested on the following Monday. Please help your child to learn these at home, little and often is best.

Counting - oral counting, chanting and testing of number bonds works best, so the children have rapid recall of these facts which greatly improves their ability to access mathematics across the curriculum.
