

Benwick Primary School – Spring Term 2025 Curriculum Map for Owls Class



English: In English we will be beginning our learning by writing a newspaper article linked to our guided reading story. We will look at the structure of newspapers and they key features. Later in the term we will be moving on to look at stories from other cultures writing a narrative text. This again will link to our guided reading texts. Finally, we will begin to look at the characteristics of third person adventure stories, preparing to write our own.	Maths: In maths we will be doing some more learning on multiplication and division, moving into multiplying two- and three-digits numbers by 1 and 2 digits. We will then move on to learn about length and perimeter before developing our understanding further of fractions. We will then finish the term by learning about mass and capacity.	Science: Our science this term will be looking at electricity and different types of circuits and the components within them. We will investigate what happens when components are changed or removed.
RE: . In RE we will be looking at why prayer is important to Muslims, understanding different elements of the religion and their places of worship.	PSHE: We will be following the Cambridgeshire PSHE curriculum module entitled Citizenship, Rights Rules and Responsibilities.	PE/Games: One lesson of PE each week will be taught by the sports coach. This term this will be gymnastics and basketball. Mrs Clutton will be teaching fitness and golf. Our PE days will be Thursday and Friday
Computing: We will be learning about graphing and simulations.	French: In French we will be learning how to talk about food and then moving around and transport.	Music: We will learn about music notation, learning how to read simple music we will also continue our learning about singing.
Art/DT: In art we will explore proportion and scale by creating images of the human form. We will also use shape and colour to create the illusion of movement, looking in particular at the work of Alberto Giacometti. In DT, we will be working with textiles and sewing to answer the question "how do you stop a teatowel from falling off a hook". We will then move on to learn about geodesic structures and which shapes make stronger structures.	History/Geography: In history we will be learning about the Shang Dynasty and comparing and contrasting with other ancient civilisations we have learned about. In geography we will be exploring our country and its regions including how each region is divided into counties.
